**This course** will be a “hands on” music course, with participants actively engaged in playing a variety of singing games. These games form a springboard for musical learning, helping children to experience musical skills including beat, rhythm, pitch, dynamics, tempo and the development of inner hearing. Other topics covered will include:

how to develop the child’s ability to sing in tune;

listening skills;

how music forms the basis of holistic learning.

Participants will be given a handout of all music covered in the session.

**Lucinda Geoghegan** graduated in music from the University of Edinburgh in 1982, completed a postgraduate teaching qualification at Moray House College of Education, and trained with the Kodály Institute of Britain where she gained an Advanced Diploma in musicianship with Distinction. She is currently a theory and musicianship lecturer at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland, working in both the Senior and Junior departments, and in addition since 2011 has also been delivering and

assessing RCS accredited modules in Kodály Philosophy to external students. She is a regular tutor for the British Kodály Academy.

Lucinda is Education Director for the National Youth Choir of Scotland and her work increasingly includes Staff Development training across Britain presenting workshops on Kodály musicianship and methodology. Lucinda is a regular guest lecturer on the summer and yearly courses at the Kodály Institute in Kecskemét, Hungary and in addition has delivered workshops in Ireland, Germany, Holland, Singapore, Indonesia and Australia.

Publications written by Lucinda for NYCoS include – *Singing Games and Rhymes for Tiny Tots*, *Singing Games and Rhymes for Early Years*, *Singing Games and Rhymes for Middle Years* and with Dr László Nemes *Singing Games and Rhymes for ages 9 to 99*. With Christopher Bell she wrote the musicianship programme *Go for Bronze*, *Go for Silver* and *Go for Gold*. Future publications include *More Singing Games and Rhymes for Early Years*, *More Singing Games and Rhymes for Middle Years* and *Singing Games and Rhymes in Mother Tongue*.
